Think about what we have been learning and write a suggestion in your book.



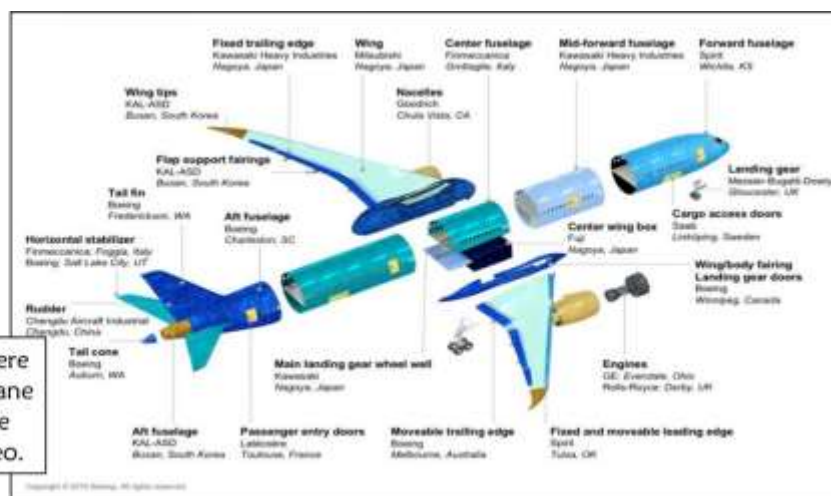
Manufactured products are goods made by hand or machines out of raw materials. It requires many different countries to make a basic product that we buy, such as a pair of jeans. This shows that manufactured products are a good example of globalisation.

The answer to the task above is that all the countries shown are involved in making an iPhone. It is designed in the USA, the camera is made in Japan, the microchip is made in South Korea and it is all manufactured in China. Did you get it correct?

Keyword Alert!

Raw material = A resource (something useful), which has been taken from the Earth and not changed, for example wood or water.
