#### WHAT IS ZAKAH?

Zakah: This is one of the 5 pillars of Islam. It means purification and involves Muslims giving 2.5% of their disposable income to charity.

- Zakah mean purification since the act of giving to charity is said to purify the giver's soul of greed and make them think of those less fortunate. It also helps to purify society be lessening the gap between the rich and the poor.
- Zakah can only be given to other Muslims such as prisoners, students, recent reverts (converts), poor, sick. It cannot go towards the mosque.
- Zakah can be paid monthly, yearly or 5 yearly.
- Muslims who cannot afford to give to charity perform the duty by offering up their time or skills instead (volunteering). Those who cannot even do this perform the duty by receiving zakah graciously.
- Muslims can also give voluntary charity to anyone at any time this is known as sadaqah.
- Qurbani meat is given at the end of Hajj as part of Eid-ul-Adha, it comes from the animal sacrifice, which may be a sheep, goat, cow or camel.


- 1. Take the salary

## **OTHER CHARITY IN ISLAM**

- Zakah is not the only form of charity in Islam.
- Another form of charity in Islam involves distributing meat at the end of Eid-ul-Adha, known as Qurbani meat, which has been sacrificed.
- The meat is split in 3:
  - 1/3 for the Muslim
  - 1/3 is given to the poor
  - 1/3 is given to family and friends
